#### STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission often recruits non-permanent staff. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- <u>temporary agents</u> are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- <u>contract agents</u> may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

#### **WE ARE**

DG BUDGET is responsible for managing the budget of the European Union. This includes proposing and implementing the financial framework, as well as collecting the resources that EU countries have agreed to contribute.

Within DG BUDGET, Directorate B plays a central role as it is responsible for the design and implementation of the revenue side and the long-term spending priorities of the EU budget (Multiannual Financial Framework).

In Directorate B, unit B2 deals with revenue aspects. The mission of the unit is to develop the revenue policy in line with EU policy priorities and developments on the expenditure side of the EU budget. Our unit is responsible for the analytical and conceptual work on EU budget revenue including new own resources, and revenue forecasts. It is responsible for the Own Resources legislation, which includes interactions with other services in the Commission, with the Council and Parliament. The unit oversees the financial actions following the control of the statistical own resources performed by Eurostat.

#### **WE PROPOSE**

Unit B.2 of DG BUDG is seeking to hire one Economic and Policy Assistant.

An interesting position providing financial and statistical support to the unit. The position includes the management of financial and accounting actions for some own resources (GNI and plastic own resources).

The post will also include statistical support to the unit – support to the annual forecasting exercise of own resources and any other request to extract data and calculation of revenues.

Finally, the person will coordinate inputs for reports for the Directorate. He will work closely with the director and his team.

The unit offers an open and friendly working environment.



#### **WE LOOK FOR**

We are looking for an Economic and Policy Assistant.

The ideal profile for the job is a competent and motivated colleague with organisational skills, a good sense of initiative and the ability to work in a team. She/he should be well organised, have good IT and quantitative skills. Familiarity with the revenue side of the EU budget, EC financial procedures and experience with Microsoft Excel would be an asset. Given the context of the work, an experience in a policy job would also be an asset. The job requires a good understanding of the political context of the work, a high team spirit, as well as an aptitude for coordination. Our working languages are English and French.

# 1. Selection

# Am I eligible to apply?

#### You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a temporary agent at the European Commission if you:

#### General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen;
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service;
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the post;
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.

#### **Qualifications:**

In order to be recruited in this position, you must have at least either a level of post-secondary education attested by a diploma,  $\underline{or}$  a level of secondary education attested by a diploma giving access to post-secondary education, and appropriate professional experience of at least three years.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted. Furthermore, before recruitment, you will be required to provide the documents that corroborate the eligibility criteria (diplomas, certificates and other supporting documents).

## Languages:

• have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the

• AND a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2) of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

# What about the selection steps?

The post was published internally within the Commission, inter-institutionally, and brought to the attention of competition laureates.

In accordance with Article 29 of the Staff Regulations, applications from Commission officials, officials from other Institutions, and laureates of competitions have priority. Only in the case that no suitable candidate can be found from the afore-mentioned categories this vacancy notice is published and is open to other applicants<sup>2</sup>.

The selection panel will choose a limited number of candidates for interview, based on the CV and motivation letter that they submitted. Due to the large volume of applications, we may receive, only candidates selected for the next step of the selection phase will be notified.

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English and possibly in a second official language.

#### 2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to supply documentary evidence in support of the statements made in their application.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical checkup, carried out by the Commission.

## > Type of contract and working conditions

The place of employment will be in **Brussels**.

In case the successful candidate is an external candidate, s/he will be engaged as a **temporary** agent under Article 2(b)/2(d) of the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants, in function group AST.

The recruitment grade, as well as the step in that grade, will be defined on the basis of the duration of the candidates' previous appropriate professional experience, in accordance with <u>Commission Decision C(2013)8970</u> laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The duration of the **1**<sup>st</sup> **contract will be of 1 to 3 years.** The contract might then be extended only once for a maximum of 2 years and in the interest of service. The duration of the extension will be defined according to the General Implementation Rules in force at that moment, in accordance with <u>Commission Decision C(2013)9049</u> on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents.

All new staff have to successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. The provisions guiding the calculation of these allowances can be consulted in the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.
