#### STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission often recruits non-permanent staff. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- <u>temporary agents</u> are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- contract agents may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

#### **WE ARE**

Eurostat (DG ESTAT), one of the Directorates-General of the European Commission, is the statistical office of the European Union. Eurostat's mission is to provide high quality statistics and data on Europe. Eurostat co-ordinates statistical activities at Union level and more particularly inside the Commission.

Unit C5 of Eurostat "Integrated Global Accounts and Balance of Payments" is responsible for the production and dissemination of high-quality statistics in the areas of balance of payments (BOP) and supply, use and input-output (SUIOT) data, widely used in EU policies and by national governments, researchers and the general public. Within Unit's C5 friendly and dynamic environment, a team of seven is responsible for the collection, validation and dissemination of BOP data.

#### **WE PROPOSE**

Unit C5 of Eurostat is seeking to hire one contract agent FG IV - Statistical Officer.

We offer a position for a contract agent contributing to the production and dissemination of BOP statistics and international investment position (IIP), as well as the related process analysis. The selected candidate will monitor and assess the quality of data and metadata sent by Member States and EFTA countries to Eurostat, as well as the respective compliance with legal requirements. This includes the joint preparation of BOP news releases and statistical articles disseminated on Eurostat's Statistics Explained website.

The selected candidate will contribute to methodological work on BOP statistics and provide methodological advice to Eurostat's hierarchy, as well as national and international counterparts, on the interpretation and implementation of statistical guides and manuals. They will contribute to answering users' requests, facilitating data analysis and forecasting, and will also be expected to represent the team in internal and external meetings, working groups and task forces (under the supervision of an official).

As a member of the BOP team, it is intended that the selected candidate contributes to the preparation of EU aggregates by running ad-hoc applications in MDT and R. In addition, they will provide support and advice regarding the management of database issues, as well as the introduction of seasonal adjustment on quarterly BOP data.

The position offers frequent contacts with other services of the European Commission, as well as with other EU Institutions, international organisation and Member States.

#### **WE LOOK FOR**

We are looking for a colleague experienced with macro-economic accounting frameworks and the underlying data and related data sources. Knowledge of BOP methodology (BPM6, OECD BD4) and basic National Accounts (ESA 2010/2008 SNA) is crucial. The selected candidate will be asked to analyse methodological issues related to the macro-economic accounting frameworks and to present the results at various international fora.

It would be an advantage if the successful candidate would be familiar with Oracle, MDT and Business Objects. Knowledge of R would be appreciated.

The selected candidate will show multipurpose abilities and intellectual curiosity, as well as aptitude in handling figures and analysing information. They will have a strong sense of responsibility, initiative and service orientation. They should be able to work under pressure and show problem solving abilities when faced with unexpected situations and tight deadlines. Ability to work in a team, as well as good organisation and coordination skills, are crucial.

The working language of the team is English. Knowledge of other Community languages is valuable.

#### **HOW TO EXPRESS YOUR INTEREST?**

With a view to guaranteeing equal access to all, the Commission recruits from an open database of spontaneous applications. The present call for interests aims at helping the recruiters to identify potentially interested candidates within this database.

## 1. Selection

# Am I eligible to apply?

### You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a contract agent at the European Commission if you:

#### General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen;
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service;
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the position;
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.
- Have passed an EPSO CAST in the relevant Function Group for this position. At the stage of the application, it is sufficient to be registered in the <u>EPSO CAST</u> data base.

#### Qualifications:

- (a) Have a level of post-secondary education attested by a diploma OR
- (b) a level of secondary education attested by a diploma giving access to post-secondary education, and appropriate professional experience of at least three years.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted.

#### Languages:

 have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the EU<sup>1</sup>

• AND have a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2)<sup>2</sup> of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

# What about the selection steps?

The selecting unit chooses from the EPSO database<sup>3</sup> candidates with the appropriate profile and invites them to an interview. For the interview a selection panel is set-up to assess the best candidates. Due to the large volume of applications that we may receive only candidates selected for the interview will be notified.

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English.

#### 2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to provide documentary evidence in support of the statements made in the database and, where relevant, the call for interest.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical checkup carried out by the Commission.

#### Type of contract and working conditions

The place of employment will be in **Luxembourg**.

The successful candidate will be engaged as a **contract agent under Article 3(b) of the** <u>Conditions of Employment of Other Servants</u>, in function group FG IV. General information on Contract Agents can be found at this link.

The grade or proposed grade range, as well as the step in that grade, will be defined on the basis of the candidates' previous professional experience, in accordance with  $\underline{\text{Commission Decision}}$   $\underline{\text{C(2017)6760}}$  laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The duration of the first **contract will be of 1 year.** Subject to the interest of the service, the contract can be extended to a maximum duration of 6 years.

The duration of the extension will be defined according to the General Implementation Rules in force at that moment, in accordance with <u>Commission Decision C(2017)6760</u> on policies for the engagement and use of contract agents.
