	A major part of our work concerns the enforcement of the Digital Services Act. This is a growing, dynamic and highly motivated team of enforcers from a broad variety of background.					
	The Digital Services Act and the Digital Markets Act constitute ground-					

breaking new digital regulations and are amongst this Commission's priority actions in the field of digital rules and regulations as part of the policies to build Europe fit for the digital age.The Commission has established a new regulatory entity within DG CONNECT, in a dedicated 'Platforms Directorate'. Inside this Directorate, the Digital Services Act Enforcement Team will be tasked with the regulatory work, under worldwide unique new powers of the Commission, supervising "very large online platforms" and "very large online search engines." designated by the Commission, i.e. those with more than 45 million users in the EU. This includes search engines and platforms such as social media sites, video-sharing platforms, and online marketplaces. The designated very large online platforms and search engines are also charged a supervisory fee on an annual basis, that the Commission needs to collect and manage. The Commission is also called to chair and convene the meetings of the DSA Board.With these ground-breaking new regulatory powers, the Commission supervises the systems that such online platforms put into place to tackle lilegal content, fight disinformation, uphold user rights, and protect user's health and wellbeing – hand-in-hand with the national regulatory authorities. The team cooperates closely and seamlessly with the newly established European Centre for Algorithmic Transparency, established at the Commission's joint Research Centre. Part of the work involves scrutinising platforms' recommender systems and content moderation algorithms, as part of their overall compliance with the Digital Services Act. ## Functions and duties

### + <u>POLICY ANALYSIS</u>

- Contribute to the assessment of systemic and emerging issues across the Union in relation to the DSA.
- Liaise, in coordination with the relevant staff in the Representation and DG CONNECT, with designated services in the relevant Member State to support the effective implementation of the rules;
- Monitor, assess and report to Headquarters on positions and reactions of national governments, industry, stakeholders and media to (planned or adopted) enforcement decisions, thereby actively engaging with relevant stakeholders to gather knowledge and evidence to support the application of the DSA as regards designated service; monitor and report to Headquarters on markets, technology, research and trade issues and provide early warning on sensitive policy, trade or technology issues in relation to DSA implementation as regards designated services.
- As part of multi-disciplinary case-teams, detect, investigate, and analyse potential infringements of the DSA by designated services in coordination with DG CONNECT;
- Contribute to the internal work aiming at ensuring the overall consistency between the supervision and enforcement of the DSA and other related Union law instruments or national laws.

### + POLICY MONITORING

- Support DG CONNECT in carrying out investigations, and in particular inspections, of designated entities and related activities.
- Contribute to joint investigations related to compliance by the designated services, in cooperation with Digital Services Coordinators.
- Carrying out monitoring and control activities.
- Compile complaints and feedback from authorities, civil society organisations and companies (large and small) in the relevant Member State about particular practices of designated services that may be hard to detect by supervisors and could also impact the provision of services in the Union.
- Draft briefing notes on the specific policy domain and issues related to designated services.

### + REPRESENTATION, NEGOTIATION and PARTICIPATION

- Liaise closely with the Digital Services Coordinator and other competent authorities tasked with the enforcement of the Digital Services Act, relevant ministries and the wider local expert and stakeholder communities.
- Promote understanding of the DSA and its provisions amongst national policy makers, and stakeholders; maintain regular contacts with stakeholders on DSA in the digital ecosystem in the relevant Member State and explain DSA implementation in the EU to them.
- Support the Representation on matters related to the enforcement of the DSA; follow particular expertise and knowledge in civil society and academia in the relevant Member State.
- Contribute to the Representation's preparation of visits by Members of the College or senior officials to the relevant Member State in relation to the enforcement of the DSA by the Commission.
- Support the work of the Representation in the fight against disinformation with regard to designated very large online platforms in line with the MoU between DG CONNECT and DG COMM.
- Under the authority of the Head of Representation and the relevant management in DG CONNECT, organise events, participate in external events (training, presentations, fora, etc.) that are relevant to the enforcement of the DSA vis-à-vis designated services.

A Memorandum of Understanding between DG COMM and DG CONNECT defines the practical working arrangements that will govern the respective responsibilities in this specific profile. This post is formally assigned to DG COMM to be placed at the disposal of DG CONNECT in the Commission's Representations in Member States for the duration of the assignment. The MoU is based on Regulation (EU) 2022/2065 (the "Digital Services Act"), which entrusts DG CONNECT with direct supervisory powers over online platforms and online search engines with more than 45 million users in the EU when it comes to online harms, such as illegal content online, disinformation or protection of minors. This post is entrusted with supervisory tasks regarding those very large online platforms and search engines under the DSA. The selected person will work under the steer of DG CONNECT and the authority of the Head of Representation and in full coordination and complementarity with other staff of the Representation.
