## STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission offers non-permanent positions. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- <u>temporary agents</u> are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- <u>contract agents</u> may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

## **WE ARE**

Unit D3 (Resolution and deposit insurance) in DG FISMA is responsible for crisis management and deposit insurance policies that impact the lives of millions of EU citizens. The unit's mission is to build a well-functioning crises management framework for the financial sector to manage crisis in banks, insurers and central clearing counterparties and to ensure that EU rules are enforced correctly. The Unit consists of 15 officials who work as a team to ensure that if these financial institutions fail, they are dealt with in an orderly manner to avoid adverse effects on depositors, policyholders, taxpayers, financial stability and the economy, and to limit contagion to other market participants.

The unit is currently working on a wide range of initiatives. In the banking sector, this includes the political negotiations of the review of the Crisis Management and Deposit Insurance framework (BRRD, DGSD, SRMR), the preparation of policy solutions to develop a European system of deposit insurance, the preparation for a report on the single market for banking, including competitiveness of the banking sector, and the design of policy solutions for the provision of liquidity in resolution. In the insurance sector, this includes the implementation of the Insurance Recovery and Resolution Directive and work on a report and possible legislative initiative on Insurance Guarantee Schemes. In the central clearing counterparty sector, this focuses on the implementation of the CCP Recovery and Resolution Regulation.

## **WE PROPOSE**

DG FISMA.D.3 is seeking to hire one lawyer or economist.

We propose a highly challenging and rewarding position of policy officer to reinforce the team on bank crisis management and deposit insurance and non-bank recovery and resolution.

We are looking for a candidate who is interested in:

· Shaping the policy and legislation in the field of financial stability and crisis management,



- · Provide legal and/or economic advice,
- Prepare and participate in negotiations with other European institutions, including implementing measures in the supervisory agencies,
- Represent the unit in discussions with other DGs, institutions and stakeholders,
- Participate in international discussions regarding resolution and deposit insurance matters (FSB, OECD, IMF, etc).

#### **WE LOOK FOR**

- An outstanding lawyer or economist with excellent drafting and communication skills, with a track record of delivering high quality results under tight deadlines,
- A strong team player with excellent inter-personal skills,
- Familiar with the Commission's procedures, in particular in policymaking,
- A desire to be part of a dynamic, hard-working and innovative team that is shaping the future of the EU banking,
- A solid understanding of financial markets, and proven expertise with at least five years of experience in banking and bank resolution is strongly encouraged. Experience of EU financial legislation more broadly would be an asset.

## 1. Selection

## Am I eligible to apply?

## You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a temporary agent at the European Commission if you:

## General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the post
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.

## **Qualifications:**

In order to be recruited for this position, you must have at least a level of education which corresponds to completed university studies of at least 3 years attested by a diploma.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted. Furthermore, before recruitment, you will be required to provide the documents that corroborate the eligibility criteria (diplomas, certificates and other supporting documents).

## Languages:

- have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the  $FU^2$
- AND a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2) of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

## What about the selection steps?

The post was published internally within the Commission, inter-institutionally, and brought to the attention of competition laureates.

In accordance with Article 29 of the Staff Regulations, applications from Commission officials, officials from other Institutions, and laureates of competitions have priority<sup>3</sup>. If these candidates do not best fit the requirements for the position, the Commission can recruit a temporary agent.

A selection panel will choose a limited number of candidates for interview, based on the CV and application form that they submitted. Due to the large volume of applications, we may receive, **only candidates selected for the next step of the selection phase will be notified.** 

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English and possibly in a second official language.

## 2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to supply documentary evidence in support of the statements made in their application.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical checkup, carried out by the Commission.

## > Type of contract and working conditions

The place of employment will be **Brussels.** 

In case the successful candidate is not an official or a competition laureate, they will be recruited as a **temporary agent under Article 2(b)/2(d) of the** <u>Conditions of Employment of Other Servants</u>, in function group AD.

## Grade

The recruitment grade, as well as the step in that grade, will be determined in accordance with <u>Commission Decision C(2013)9049</u> on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents and with <u>Commission Decision C(2013)8970</u> laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The recruitment grade will be that of a new published competition or already planned in the field. If there is none, recruitment will be at the level of AD5. The Authority authorised to conclude Contracts of Employment ('AACE') may grant a grade AD6 or AD7 based on an assessment of the needs of the service, including without limitation the nature of the profile sought, the level of responsibility to be exercised or the labour market conditions for the profile in question, and on the duration of the candidates' previous appropriate professional experience. The maximum recruitment grade is AD8, which may be granted under very exceptional circumstances.

The duration of the **1**<sup>st</sup> **contract will be of 1 to 3 years.** The contract might then be extended only once for a maximum of 2 years and in the interest of service. The duration of the extension will be defined according to the General Implementation Rules in force at that moment, in accordance with <u>Commission Decision C(2013)9049</u> on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents.

All new staff have to successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. The provisions guiding the calculation of these allowances can be consulted in the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.

The European Commission applies a policy of equal opportunities and non-discrimination in accordance with Article 1d of the Staff Regulations.
