Recruitment will however remain strictly based on the merits of all applicants and no positions will be reserved for nationals of any specific Member State.

STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission offers non-permanent positions. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- <u>temporary agents</u> are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- <u>contract agents</u> may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

WE ARE

Unit RTD.A.5 "Innovation Policy & Access to Finance" is in charge of steering the development and implementation of the Union's policy for innovation, including through the European Innovation Act, innovation procurement policies, as well as access to finance for innovative companies. It designs, implements and monitors policy and legislative actions to remove bottlenecks to innovation and access to finance, including through favourable framework conditions, and to strengthen and better connect innovation ecosystems at all levels.

It organises the work of the European Innovation Council Forum, with a view to facilitate the coordination of innovation policy initiatives between Member States, Associated Countries and the European Union.

The unit oversees the implementation of InvestEU, including through ensuring the chairmanship of the Research, Innovation and Digitisation Window, coordinates the relationship between DG RTD and the European Investment Bank Group and advises other units in DG RTD on the conception, development and implementation of financial instruments supporting innovation.

Finally, the unit contributes to the strategic planning of Horizon Europe in particular by overseeing the preparation of the European Innovation Ecosystems Work Programme. In respect of this Work Programme, the Unit is responsible for managing the relation between the Commission and the European Innovation Council and SMEs Executive Agency (EISMEA) and for ensuring monitoring and supervision of the work of EISMEA at operational level. The unit is composed of 18 staff.

WE PROPOSE

If you are interested in supporting policy making and implementation in a groundbreaking area with significant economic and societal impact, linked to the Union's top priorities, this position is for you. We offer a highly interesting position in a friendly and motivating environment, a real opportunity to demonstrate high level of pro-activeness through a variety of tasks and possibilities for personal development.

Your responsibilities would include managing relations with the European Investment Bank (EIB)



Group, in particular providing policy steer to the implementation of InvestEU, and/or contributing to the conception, development and implementation of new financial instruments supporting innovation. You may also be asked to contribute to the development and implementation of EU innovation policy and legislation, in particular the European Innovation Act.

WE LOOK FOR

The ideal candidate should have a:

- sense of initiative and flexibility and strong sense of commitment and service towards the Commission;
- confirmed capacity to work on different issues, to deal with high workload and deliver quality work under often tight deadlines;
- problem solving and decision-making skills;
- ability to analyse complex situations in a systematic and well-structured way, both from the strategic and operational perspective, to come to sound conclusions and make appropriate recommendations;
- excellent written and oral communication skills in order to communicate efficiently and fluently with internal and external stakeholders.

Knowledge or experience in one or more of the following fields would be an asset:

- development and implementation of innovation policy instruments;
- a solid and proven knowledge of innovative finance and financial instruments supporting innovation;
- experience in collaboration with other services of the Commission, with Member States, with numerous stakeholders and/or with the EIB Group.

HOW TO EXPRESS YOUR INTEREST?

With a view to guaranteeing equal access to all, the Commission recruits from an open database of spontaneous applications. The present call for interests aims at helping the recruiters to identify potentially interested candidates within this database.

In practice, to express your interest, please follow the subsequent two steps:

- 1. If you are not registered yet in the open EPSO database, please do so at the following address: <u>CAST Permanent</u>. Please select under selection procedures for contract agent the CAST permanent profile that best suits your education and experience.
- 2. You should send your documents in a single pdf in the following order:

1. your CV 2. completed application form.

1. Selection

> Am I eligible to apply?

You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a contract agent at the European Commission if you:

General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen;
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service;
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the position;
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.

Qualifications:

(a) Have a level of education which corresponds to completed university studies of at least three years attested by a diploma.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted.

Languages:

- have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the EU²
- AND have a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2)³ of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

What about the selection steps?

The selecting unit chooses from the EPSO database⁴ candidates with the appropriate profile and invites them to an interview. For the interview a selection panel is set-up to assess the best candidates. Due to the large volume of applications that we may receive only candidates selected for the interview will be notified.

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English and possibly in a second official language.

2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to provide documentary evidence in support of the statements made in the database and, where relevant, the call for interest.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical checkup carried out by the Commission.

Type of contract and working conditions

The place of employment will be in **Brussels**.

The successful candidate will be engaged as a **contract agent under Article 3(b) of the** <u>Conditions of Employment of Other Servants</u>, in function group FG IV. General information on Contract Agents can be found at this link.

The grade or proposed grade range, as well as the step in that grade, will be defined on the basis of the candidates' previous professional experience, in accordance with $\underline{\text{Commission Decision}}$ $\underline{\text{C(2017)6760}}$ laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The duration of the **first contract will be 1 year.** Subject to the interest of the service, the contract may be renewed one or more times up to a maximum duration of 6 years.

The duration of the renewal(s) will be defined according to the General Implementing Rules in force at that moment (currently, <u>Commission Decision C(2017)6760</u> on policies for the engagement and use of contract agents).

Contract agents recruited in Function Group IV have to successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. The provisions guiding the calculation of these allowances can be consulted in the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.
