STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission offers non-permanent positions. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- <u>temporary agents</u> are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- <u>contract agents</u> may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

WE ARE

Unit A1 supports EU Member States and associated countries in strengthening their research and innovation systems and capacities and enhancing their performance. It seeks to improve the quantity, quality and impact of national public R&I policy and investment, through reforms in support of the broader European objectives, and push the transformation towards sustainable competitiveness for the benefit of all.

To this end, the unit coordinates the work on the R&I dimension of the European Semester and monitors the implementation of the Recovery and Resilience Plans. Through evidence-based policy dialogue and continuous outreach, the unit acts as an interface between EU, national and subnational R&I systems. In particular, the unit leads on the design of R&I measures to advance Europe as a whole, monitors its implementation and strengthens the R&I dimension of the Cohesion Policy, setting the conditions and enabling better synergies between the two programmes.

WE PROPOSE

A highly interesting administrative assistant position in Unit A.1 - European Semester & Country Intelligence. They will have a range of tasks and functions within the core activities of the unit, including:

- Provide daily administrative support through dedicated EC tools for the efficient functioning of the unit e.g. task allocation, deadline tracking, handling of stakeholder correspondence and following-up on requests from the DG and the Cabinet
- Provide logistical support for organisation of meetings
- · Manage the functional mailbox of the secretariat
- Coordinate the briefing requests, launch interservice consultations and adoption procedures



- · Supervising and coordinating mission planning and other personnel administration processes
- Organise and manage missions for colleagues
- · Ensure proper document management and filing
- Assist the Head of Unit in the management of human resources of the unit
- Assist integration of and provide administrative support to new members of the unit
- · Backup for budget planning and monitoring and providing help with procurement procedures
- Perform any other relevant tasks based on the needs of the service

WE LOOK FOR

We look for a motivated, dynamic, proactive, and result-driven colleague with a good sense of initiative and responsibility. They should have excellent organisational skills and assure quality and accuracy in performing a diversity of tasks without constant supervision. The candidate should be a dedicated team player with a pragmatic approach to problem-solving and should possess good interpersonal skills, enabling effective collaboration with diverse colleagues across the DG and with other services.

Knowledge of general Microsoft office applications (Word, Outlook, SharePoint etc) is required and proficiency in Teams highly valuable. Experience with the European Commission's administrative procedures and informatics tools (Ares, MIPS, AGM, etc.) is a valuable asset. Good knowledge of EN is essential; FR and/or other languages would be an asset.

ANNEX

1. Selection

> Am I eligible to apply?

You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a temporary agent at the European Commission if you:

General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the post
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.

Oualifications:

In order to be recruited for this position, you must have at least

- a level of post-secondary education attested by a diploma, or
- a level of secondary education attested by a diploma giving access to post-secondary education, and appropriate professional experience of at least three years.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted. Furthermore, before recruitment, you will be required to provide the documents that corroborate the eligibility criteria (diplomas, certificates and other supporting documents).

Languages:

Languages

 have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the EU²

 AND a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2) of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

What about the selection steps?

The post was published internally within the Commission, inter-institutionally, and brought to the attention of competition laureates.

In accordance with Article 29 of the Staff Regulations, applications from Commission officials, officials from other Institutions, and laureates of competitions have priority³. If these candidates do not best fit the requirements for the position, the Commission can recruit a temporary agent.

A selection panel will choose a limited number of candidates for interview, based on the CV and application form that they submitted. Due to the large volume of applications, we may receive, **only candidates selected for the next step of the selection phase will be notified.**

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English and possibly in another language.

2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to supply documentary evidence in support of the statements made in their application.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical checkup, carried out by the Commission.

Type of contract and working conditions

The place of employment will be **Brussels.**

In case the successful candidate is not an official or a competition laureate, they will be recruited as a **temporary agent under Article 2(b)/2(d) of the** Conditions of Employment of Other Servants, in function groups AST/SC.

Grade

The recruitment grade, as well as the step in that grade, will be determined in accordance with <u>Commission Decision C(2025)4716</u> on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents and with <u>Commission Decision C(2013)8970</u> laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The recruitment grade will be calculated based on the qualifications and the number of years of professional experience, according to Art. 13 of the Commission Decision C(2025)4716. Higher grades may be granted exceptionally.

The duration of the **1**st **contract will be of 1 to 4 years.** The contract might then be extended only once for a maximum of 2 years and in the interest of service, in accordance with <u>Commission Decision C(2025)4716</u> on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents.

All new staff have to successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. The provisions guiding the calculation of these allowances can be consulted in the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.

The European Commission applies a policy of equal opportunities and non-discrimination in accordance with Article 1d of the Staff Regulations.
