STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission offers non-permanent positions. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- <u>temporary agents</u> are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- <u>contract agents</u> may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

WE ARE

DG Trade and Economic Security is responsible for leading the EU's common commercial policy, one of the exclusive competences of the EU. Trade policy plays a critical role in enhancing the EU's economic competitiveness, shaping globalisation, and defending the EU from unfair trade practices and threats to its economic security. Within DG TRADE, Directorate B is responsible for bilateral trade and investment relations with countries of the Far East. In addition, Directorate B is in charge of negotiating, as well as of managing and coordinating the implementation of trade agreements and of developing EU trade policy, regarding services and investment, digital trade, intellectual property and public procurement.

Unit TRADE.B.2 is responsible for the EU's trade policy in two crucial areas of the EU economy: Services and Investment.

WE PROPOSE

This position offers the opportunity to contribute to shaping EU trade policy on services and investment, including by negotiating international trade and investment agreements with third countries. The selected candidate will monitor and analyse global policy developments and third-country positions to inform and develop the EU's negotiating positions in bilateral, plurilateral and multilateral negotiations on services and investment. The candidate will also monitor the implementation of the services and investment parts of existing trade agreements. Additionally, the candidate will follow legislative and policy developments in the internal market relevant for trade in services and investment and contribute to drafting EU policy and legislative documents and will represent the Directorate-General in technical meetings and working groups.



Furthermore, the candidate will prepare clear briefings for senior officials, including on politically sensitive issues, and contribute to internal reporting on developments in the areas of services and investment.

This position involves frequent contact with third-country officials, Member States and EU institutions, the private sector, civil society representatives, and other Commission services. Additionally, it can require regular international travel.

WE LOOK FOR

We are looking for a highly competent and motivated colleague to join a very knowledgeable team of 21 people working on trade in services and on investment. The ideal candidate should have a very solid background, excellent analytical and conceptual skills, and the ability to write and present complex legal and/or policy issues in a clear manner. The candidate should have both practical and theoretical knowledge of international trade and investment policy and experience in international negotiations. Knowledge of EU inter-institutional decision-making and procedures would also be an advantage.

In addition, the candidate should have a strong sense of initiative and be able to work autonomously under the guidance of his/ her hierarchy. The candidate should have the capacity to negotiate with international partners, should be resilient to stress, flexible, and able to handle a variety of files and negotiations for which unit TRADE.B.2 is responsible. The candidate should also possess the capacity to develop good interpersonal relations within the Commission, other institutions, and third-country interlocutors.

ANNEX

1. Selection

> Am I eligible to apply?

You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a temporary agent at the European Commission if you:

General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the post
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.

Qualifications:

In order to be recruited for this position, you must have at least a level of education which corresponds to completed university studies of at least 3 years attested by a diploma.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted. Furthermore, before recruitment, you will be required to provide the documents that corroborate the eligibility criteria (diplomas, certificates and other supporting documents).

Languages:

- $^{\bullet}$ have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the EU^2
- AND a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2) of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

What about the selection steps?

The post was published internally within the Commission, inter-institutionally, and brought to the attention of competition laureates.

In accordance with Article 29 of the Staff Regulations, applications from Commission officials, officials from other Institutions, and laureates of competitions have priority³. If these candidates do not best fit the requirements for the position, the Commission can recruit a temporary agent.

For temporary agents under Article 2(a) of the <u>Conditions of Employment of Other Servants</u>, the post is published directly on the EPSO website, without mandatory prior internal publication.

A selection panel will choose a limited number of candidates for interview, based on the CV and application form that they submitted. Due to the large volume of applications, we may receive, **only candidates selected for the next step of the selection phase will be notified.**

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English and possibly in another language.

2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to supply documentary evidence in support of the statements made in their application.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical checkup, carried out by the Commission.

Type of contract and working conditions

The place of employment will be **Brussels**.

In case the successful candidate is not an official or a competition laureate, they will be recruited as a **temporary agent under Article 2(b)/2(d)/2(a) of the** <u>Conditions of Employment of Other Servants</u>, in function groups AD5-AD12.

➢ Grade

The recruitment grade, as well as the step in that grade, will be determined in accordance with <u>Commission Decision C(2025)4716</u> on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents and with <u>Commission Decision C(2013)8970</u> laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The recruitment grade will be calculated based on the qualifications and the number of years of professional experience, according to Art. 13 of the Commission Decision C(2025)4716. Higher grades may be granted exceptionally.

The duration of the **1**st **contract will be up to 4 years.** The contract might then be extended only once for a maximum of 2 years and in the interest of service, in accordance with <u>Commission Decision C(2025)4716</u> on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents.

All new staff have to successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. The provisions guiding the calculation of these allowances can be consulted in the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.
