STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission offers non-permanent positions. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- [temporary agents](#) are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- [contract agents](#) may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

WE ARE

The mission of the PMO (Office for the administration and payment of individual entitlements, or Paymaster's Office) is to provide a high quality and user-friendly service to beneficiaries by promptly and accurately managing, determining and paying individual rights and expenses (e.g. salaries, pensions, sickness insurance reimbursements and mission expenses).

The unit PMO.1 'Rights and Salaries' is responsible for providing the following services to staff in active employment in the Commission and in the other EU Institutions and bodies that have delegated these functions to the PMO:

- calculating and paying salaries (including allowances) for approximately 55 000 people per month;
- determining the individual financial rights of staff upon entry into service and whenever a life or other event changes those rights.
- Addressing queries and complaints from staff about their salaries and their rights.

The Unit works in teams, each of which is responsible for different processes falling under the Unit's responsibility (e.g. Payment of Salaries, Establishing Rights on entry into services, Family Allowances, Dependent Child Allowances, Allowances received from other sources, Customer Service). Each team is led by a Team Leader under the supervision of a Head of Sector and some structures involve matrix organisation. There are about 110 staff members split across three Sectors.

The Unit aims to provide high quality and in-time services to staff, the Commission, other institutions, Agencies and bodies in a transparent and customer-oriented way, so that Institutions and their staff can get on with their work.



WE PROPOSE

The post of Team Leader for the team with responsibility for the establishment of individual financial rights upon Entry into Service (and when rights change as a result of staff mobility or a change of nationality).

The Sector is organised in a matrix structure requiring close day to day co-ordination between two Team Leaders who are responsible for parts of the activity. The repartition of responsibilities between the two team leaders will be set and adjusted in function of operational challenges. First impressions count - the Entry into Service and Mobility team is one of the first contact points for new members of staff joining the EU institutions; how well and correctly they are treated can make a real difference to how people view their experience of working for the EU Institutions and of interacting with PMO.

In addition to leading the team, you will be expected to be able to interpret and apply the legal framework, including relevant case law. You will also work with the Head of Sector, the other Team Leader and other services to develop and simplify procedures and contribute actively to the HR transformation project, including deployment of the Onboarding Tool.

WE LOOK FOR

We are looking for someone with:

- a genuine interest in people and process management;
- excellent leadership skills (or potential), and the openness and ability needed to work in a team with the Head of Sector, the Head of Unit and other Team Leaders in the Sector;
- excellent planning, organisation and problem-solving skills;
- a high sense of diplomacy, discretion and confidentiality;
- a good ability to manage responsibilities and work under pressure;
- excellent oral and written communication skills, and very good knowledge of written and spoken French and English;
- a strong customer-service orientation, and
- who is a quick learner and has an aptitude to get to grips with the technical knowledge required to do the job.

The following qualities, would be advantageous:

- Experience in the development, review and simplification of procedures;
- Ability to explain complex issues in a clear and simple way;

Training will be provided on the Staff Regulations, the establishment of rights, the use of SYSPER Rights, and the HR Transformation initiative so prior experience in these areas is not necessary. Nevertheless, some basic knowledge in these areas would be advantageous.

ANNEX

1. Selection

➤ Am I eligible to apply?

You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a temporary agent at the European Commission if you:

General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the post
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.

Qualifications:

In order to be recruited for this position, you must have at least

- a level of post-secondary education attested by a diploma, or
- a level of secondary education attested by a diploma giving access to post-secondary education, and appropriate professional experience of at least three years.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted. Furthermore, before recruitment, you will be required to provide the documents that corroborate the eligibility criteria (diplomas, certificates and other supporting documents).

Languages:

- have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the EU²
- AND a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2) of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

➤ What about the selection steps?

² The official languages of the European Union are: BG (Bulgarian), CS (Czech), DA (Danish), DE (German), EL (Greek), EN (English), ES (Spanish), ET (Estonian), FI (Finnish), FR (French), GA (Irish), HR (Croatian), HU (Hungarian), IT (Italian), LT (Lithuanian), LV (Latvian), MT (Maltese), NL (Dutch), PL (Polish), PT (Portuguese), RO (Romanian), SK (Slovak), SL (Slovenian), SV (Swedish).



The post was published internally within the Commission, inter-institutionally, and brought to the attention of competition laureates.

In accordance with Article 29 of the Staff Regulations, applications from Commission officials, officials from other Institutions, and laureates of competitions have priority³. If these candidates do not best fit the requirements for the position, the Commission can recruit a temporary agent.

For temporary agents under Article 2(a) of the [Conditions of Employment of Other Servants](#), the post is published directly on the EPSO website, without mandatory prior internal publication.

A selection panel will choose a limited number of candidates for interview, based on the CV and application form that they submitted. Due to the large volume of applications, we may receive, **only candidates selected for the next step of the selection phase will be notified.**

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English/French and possibly in another language.

2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to supply documentary evidence in support of the statements made in their application.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical check-up, carried out by the Commission.

➤ Type of contract and working conditions

The place of employment will be **Brussels**.

In case the successful candidate is not an official or a competition laureate, they will be recruited as a **temporary agent under Article 2(b) of the [Conditions of Employment of Other Servants](#), in function groups AST.**

➤ **Grade**

The recruitment grade, as well as the step in that grade, will be determined in accordance with [Commission Decision C\(2025\)4716](#) on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents and with [Commission Decision C\(2013\)8970](#) laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The recruitment grade will be calculated based on the qualifications and the number of years of professional experience, according to Art. 13 of the Commission Decision C(2025)4716. Higher grades may be granted exceptionally.

The duration of the **1st contract will be up to 4 years**. The contract might then be extended only once for a maximum of 2 years and in the interest of service, in accordance with [Commission Decision C\(2025\)4716](#) on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents.

All new staff have to successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. The provisions guiding the calculation of these allowances can be consulted in the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.

The European Commission applies a policy of equal opportunities and non-discrimination in accordance with Article 1d of the Staff Regulations.
