STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission offers non-permanent positions. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- [temporary agents](#) are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- [contract agents](#) may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

WE ARE

Eurostat, one of the Directorates-General of the European Commission, is the statistical office of the European Union. Eurostat's mission is to provide high quality statistics and data on Europe. Eurostat co-ordinates statistical activities at Union level and more particularly inside the Commission.

The current vacancy is in a production unit working with administrative data, part of Directorate F: Social statistics. The team covers statistics on social protection expenditure and receipts, social protection recipients, as well as health finance. We contribute to the objective of Eurostat to be the reference for comparable social protection and health expenditure statistics in Europe. We support policy makers for several targeted policies and initiatives like the European Pillar of Social Rights and EU4Health. Our data are used for the European Semester, the European Core Health Indicators etc. The team cooperates on regular basis as regards the development of social protection and health finance statistics with the Commission policy DGs, notably DG EMPL, DG ECFIN and DG SANTE. We are closely cooperating with international organisations like the World Health Organisation (WHO) and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). The highly motivated and friendly Social Protection and Health Finance team is composed of 8 persons. It enjoys a very pleasant working atmosphere while responding to high expectations. We work in English, but several EU languages are spoken in the team.

WE PROPOSE

Unit F5, responsible for statistics on education, health and social protection of DG Eurostat is seeking to hire a Statistical Assistant.



The successful candidate will be part of the Social protection and Health Finance team, providing mainly IT support for those statistics, under the supervision of a team leader and in close collaboration with an Administrator colleague. The tasks concern the annual data collections in the domain of social protection statistics and health finance. More specifically, the tasks include:

- Contributing to and providing IT support to ensure the validation, processing and dissemination of the annual data and metadata including documenting their quality;
- Active participation in the continuous improvement of the statistical production process and the development and testing of the statistical IT infrastructure;
- Developing/extending the use of existing data in line with user needs;
- Cooperating with the main institutional partners (both producers and users). It includes an active role in the annual expert group on social protection and the technical group on healthcare expenditure;
- Collaborating closely with international organisations (OECD and WHO) that are collecting data based on the same methodology.

Contribution to methodological development work, data analysis and indicators' production are also included. The new colleague will cooperate closely with the rest of the team, with other units within Eurostat and with other parts of the Commission.

WE LOOK FOR

We are looking for a motivated colleague, adaptable to change and interested in working with the statistics associated with the EU health and social policies at large as well as in the management of statistical IT-processes. The following qualities would be highly appreciated:

- Proven experience in statistical production (required)
- A relevant educational background in information technologies, statistics or economics (advantage)
- Familiarity with Eurostat IT tools and standards (or a strong willingness to learn them)
- Experience with MDT and/or SQL and/or SAS (or willingness to learn)
- Basic knowledge of Java and R (advantage)
- Strong teamwork and communication skills, with a proactive, solution-oriented mindset
- A genuine interest in data; interest in social protection and public health is an asset

ANNEX

1. Selection

➤ Am I eligible to apply?

You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a temporary agent at the European Commission if you:

General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen;
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service;
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the post;
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.

Qualifications:

In order to be recruited for this position, you must have at least

- a level of post-secondary education attested by a diploma, or
- a level of secondary education attested by a diploma giving access to post-secondary education, and appropriate professional experience of at least three years.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted. Furthermore, before recruitment, you will be required to provide the documents that corroborate the eligibility criteria (diplomas, certificates and other supporting documents).

Languages:

- have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the EU²
- AND a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2) of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

➤ **What about the selection steps?**

The post was published internally within the Commission, inter-institutionally, and brought to the attention of competition laureates.

In accordance with Article 29 of the Staff Regulations, applications from Commission officials, officials from other Institutions, and laureates of competitions have priority³. If these candidates do not best fit the requirements for the position, the Commission can recruit a temporary agent.

A selection panel will choose a limited number of candidates for interview, based on the CV and application form that they submitted. Due to the large volume of applications, we may receive, **only candidates selected for the next step of the selection phase will be notified.**

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English and possibly in a second official language.

2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to supply documentary evidence in support of the statements made in their application.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical check-up, carried out by the Commission. Candidates are required to undergo a security vetting that is conducted with the national administration of the Member State.

➤ **Type of contract and working conditions**

The place of employment will be **Luxembourg**.

In case the successful candidate is not an official or a competition laureate, they will be recruited as a **temporary agent under Article 2(b)/2(d) of the [Conditions of Employment of Other Servants](#), in function group AST.**

➤ **Grade**

The recruitment grade, as well as the step in that grade, will be determined in accordance with [Commission Decision C\(2025\)4716](#) on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents and with [Commission Decision C\(2013\)8970](#) laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The recruitment grade will be calculated based on the qualifications and the number of years of professional experience, according to Art. 13 of the Commission Decision C(2025)4716. Higher grades may be granted exceptionally.

The duration of the **1st contract will be of 1 to 4 years**. The contract might then be extended only once for a maximum of 2 years and in the interest of service, in accordance with [Commission Decision C\(2025\)4716](#) on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents.

All new staff have to successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. The provisions guiding the calculation of these allowances can be consulted in the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.

The European Commission applies a policy of equal opportunities and non-discrimination in accordance with Article 1d of the Staff Regulations.
