STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission offers non-permanent positions. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- [temporary agents](#) are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- [contract agents](#) may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

WE ARE

Eurostat, one of the Directorates-General of the European Commission, is the statistical office of the European Union. Eurostat's mission is to provide high quality statistics and data on Europe. Eurostat coordinates statistical activities at Union level and more particularly inside the Commission.

Eurostat Unit F4 is responsible for statistics on living conditions, including income, consumption, and social exclusion, as well as health, time use, crime, and gender-based violence. The unit coordinates annual and periodic household surveys on income and living conditions (European Statistics on Income and Living Conditions – EU-SILC), consumption (EU Household Budget Survey – EU-HBS), time use (Harmonised European Time Use Survey – HETUS), health (European Health Interview Survey – EHIS) and gender-based violence (the EU survey on gender-based violence against women and other forms of inter-personal violence – EU-GBV). It is also responsible for indicators and analysis in the area of crime and criminal justice statistics.

WE PROPOSE

Unit F.4 of Eurostat, is seeking to hire a Statistical Assistant.

The successful candidate will join the EU-SILC micro-data production and dissemination team.

The team is in charge of:

- Routine production of EU-SILC data in the area of poverty, social exclusion, and their dissemination in Eurobase;
- Production of additional data for Statistics Explained, quality reports and variance estimation.
- Inclusion in the EU-SILC production chains of outcomes of the methodological development of (new) indicators on specific topics of political importance in close collaboration with the Indicators Subgroup of the Social Protection Committee.
- Dissemination to researchers and continuous improvement of EU-SILC microdata (User Data base UDB).



- Drafting and maintenance of metadata describing EU-SILC.
- Processing of data requests from external users.
- Continuous improvement of the production and dissemination chains, namely: improvement of timeliness; analysis of the multidimensional dimension as well as trajectories of poverty and social exclusion; integration of information on income, consumption and wealth; development of new indicators.
- Maintaining contacts with policy DGs and in particular DG EMPL on EU SILC indicators development.
- Documentation of all processes and code developed.

This work involves frequent contacts with other Eurostat units and with the Commission DGs (mainly DG EMPL, SANTE, and REGIO), an active role in Task Force meetings and the 'Living Conditions' Working Group.

Under the supervision of the team leader, the job holder will be responsible for producing EU-SILC data for a group of approximately 10-12 countries. The job holder will compile statistics for quality reports, perform variance estimation using established procedures, and contribute to the development of new indicators and statistical analyses as required. Additionally, the job holder will support other team activities, particularly in establishing a back-up role within the production team.

WE LOOK FOR

We are looking for a dynamic and motivated colleague with a background in IT and/or statistical or socio-economic analysis and with good organisational and analytical skills.

Experience with SAS or other statistical software is required.

Commitment, eye for details, high sense of responsibility and team spirit are expected. Good communication and drafting skills in English are essential and knowledge of other EU languages would be valuable.

ANNEX

1. Selection

➤ Am I eligible to apply?

You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a temporary agent at the European Commission if you:

General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the post
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.

Qualifications:

In order to be recruited for this position, you must have at least

- a level of post-secondary education attested by a diploma, or
- a level of secondary education attested by a diploma giving access to post-secondary education, and appropriate professional experience of at least three years.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted. Furthermore, before recruitment, you will be required to provide the documents that corroborate the eligibility criteria (diplomas, certificates and other supporting documents).

Languages:

- have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the EU²
- AND a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2) of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

➤ What about the selection steps?

The post was published internally within the Commission, inter-institutionally, and brought to the attention of competition laureates.

In accordance with Article 29 of the Staff Regulations, applications from Commission officials, officials from other Institutions, and laureates of competitions have priority³. If these candidates do not best fit the requirements for the position, the Commission can recruit a temporary agent.

For temporary agents under Article 2(a) of the [Conditions of Employment of Other Servants](#), the post is published directly on the EPSO website, without mandatory prior internal publication.

A selection panel will choose a limited number of candidates for interview, based on the CV and application form that they submitted. Due to the large volume of applications, we may receive, **only candidates selected for the next step of the selection phase will be notified.**

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English and possibly in another language.

2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to supply documentary evidence in support of the statements made in their application.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical check-up, carried out by the Commission.

➤ Type of contract and working conditions

The place of employment will be **Luxembourg**.

In case the successful candidate is not an official or a competition laureate, they will be recruited as a **temporary agent under Article 2(b) of the [Conditions of Employment of Other Servants](#), in function groups AST.**

➤ **Grade**

The recruitment grade, as well as the step in that grade, will be determined in accordance with [Commission Decision C\(2025\)4716](#) on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents and with [Commission Decision C\(2013\)8970](#) laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The recruitment grade will be calculated based on the qualifications and the number of years of professional experience, according to Art. 13 of the Commission Decision C(2025)4716. Higher grades may be granted exceptionally.

The duration of the **1st contract will be up to 4 years**. The contract might then be extended only once for a maximum of 2 years and in the interest of service, in accordance with [Commission Decision C\(2025\)4716](#) on policies for the engagement and use of temporary agents.

All new staff have to successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. The provisions guiding the calculation of these allowances can be consulted in the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.

The European Commission applies a policy of equal opportunities and non-discrimination in accordance with Article 1d of the Staff Regulations.
