STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission offers non-permanent positions. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- **[temporary agents](#)** are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- **[contract agents](#)** may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

WE ARE

Directorate HR.D, “Workplace & Wellbeing”, designs and implements, at corporate level, human resources policies and practices which aim to ensure that staff maintains a high level of physical and mental health and wellbeing and that the workplace is safe, comfortable, environmentally-friendly and provides for a proper work/life balance. HR.D comprises seven units (including one in Luxembourg and one in Ispra) and two Advisers (for social impact & engagement, and for medical policy questions respectively).

The Medical Service in Brussels (HR.D.3) is one of the Commission’s three occupational medicine services and is composed of more than 50 statutory and external professionals with different profiles (general practitioners, occupational physicians, psychiatrists, psychologists, nurses, social workers, medical laboratory technologists and administrative staff), organised in 4 sectors. Its overall mission is to promote the physical and mental health of active staff members and to provide medical advice to the institution and other stakeholders. Its activities include:

- Occupational medicine (including ergonomics and return to work after long-term absence);
- Preventive medicine (recruitment visits, annual visits, risk assessment);
- Travel medicine (delegation departures, missions);
- Support and guidance for staff in difficulty and to managers;
- Biological analyses;
- Basic medical care provided in the dispensary;
- General medical advice to the institution;
- The organisation of prevention campaigns (e.g. vaccinations) and health promotion;
- Invalidity procedures.

Given the mandate of the unit and the need to provide in-presence medical care, regular presence in the office is required.



WE PROPOSE

We are seeking to hire a Social Worker in the Psychosocial sector.

We are looking for a dynamic and pro-active candidate who will offer support to Commission/Agencies active staff by :

- Providing social and administrative support to employees facing complex personal or professional situations.
- Follow up on files and propose solutions adapted to individual needs.
- Collaborate with internal services and external institutions to coordinate social support.
- Participate in the development of prevention and social welfare awareness programs.
- Maintain confidentiality and professional ethics in all interventions.

You will join the psychosocial team in the Commission's Medical Service and work with staff members to provide social and administrative support, contributing to the overall well-being of the Commission's staff. You will work closely with internal departments and external partners to ensure appropriate and effective solutions.

WE LOOK FOR

The successful candidate must have:

- Recognised diploma to work as a social worker in the EU.
- At least 2 years' professional experience in social support and counselling.
- Excellent command of French and English; knowledge of another European language is an asset.
- Ability to work in a multilingual and intercultural environment.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills.
- Sense of organization, autonomy and professional rigor.

With a view to guaranteeing equal access to all, the Commission recruits from an open database of spontaneous applications. The present call for interests aims at helping the recruiters to identify potentially interested candidates within this database.

ANNEX

1. Selection

➤ Am I eligible to apply?

You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a contract agent at the European Commission if you:

General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen;
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service;
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the position;
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.
- Have passed an EPSO CAST in the relevant Function Group for this position. At the stage of the application, it is sufficient to be registered in the [EPSO CAST](#) data base.

Qualifications:

- (a) Have a level of post-secondary education attested by a diploma OR
- (b) a level of secondary education attested by a diploma giving access to post-secondary education, and appropriate professional experience of at least three years.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted.

Languages:

- have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the EU¹
- AND have a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2)² of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

➤ **What about the selection steps?**

The selecting unit chooses from [the EPSO database](#)³ candidates with the appropriate profile and invites them to an interview. For the interview a selection panel is set-up to assess the best candidates. Due to the large volume of applications that we may receive only candidates selected for the interview will be notified.

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English and possibly in a second official language.

2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to provide documentary evidence in support of the statements made in the database and, where relevant, the call for interest.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical check-up carried out by the Commission.

➤ **Type of contract and working conditions**

The place of employment will be in **Brussels**.

The successful candidate will be engaged as a **contract agent under Article 3(b) of the [Conditions of Employment of Other Servants](#), in function group FG III**. General information on Contract Agents can be found at this link.

The grade or proposed grade range, as well as the step in that grade, will be defined on the basis of the candidates' previous professional experience, in accordance with [Commission Decision C\(2017\)6760](#) laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The duration of the **first contract will be 1 years**. Subject to the interest of the service, the contract may be renewed one or more times up to a maximum duration of 6 years.

The duration of the renewal(s) will be defined according to the General Implementing Rules in force at that moment (currently, [Commission Decision C\(2017\)6760](#) on policies for the engagement and use of contract agents).

Contract agents recruited in Function Group III have to successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.
