STAFF RECRUITED ON CONTRACTS

In addition to permanent officials, the European Commission offers non-permanent positions. There are two categories of non-permanent staff:

- **[temporary agents](#)** are recruited to fill vacant positions for a set amount of time or to perform highly specialised tasks.
- **[contract agents](#)** may provide additional capacity in specialised fields where an insufficient number of officials is available or carry out a number of administrative or manual tasks. They are generally recruited for fixed-term contracts (maximum 6 years in any EU Institution), but in some cases they can be offered contracts for an indefinite duration (in offices, agencies, delegations or representations).

WE ARE

BUDG C.1 is in charge of managing of Commission's treasury, as well as the treasuries of the other entities for which the Accounting Officer of the Commission is responsible, such as the European Development Fund (EDF), the European External Action Service (EEAS), EU Trust Funds and a growing number of agencies to which the Commission provides central treasury services.

The Central Treasury is responsible for cash forecasting and maintains direct contact with national central banks, treasuries, and commercial banking partners to ensure the smooth implementation of cash management policies. It executes all the payments for the above-mentioned entities (more than 3 million payments per year) and also actively contributes to the establishment of policy instruments with regard to their funding and cash management structures (e.g. Next Generation EU, Common Provisioning Fund, ULCM etc.).

The treasury of the Commission is also managing the Own resources accounts (GNI, VAT...), receiving the amounts paid by the Member States to the Budget of the European Union. It replenishes the other institutions' treasury on their request (EEAS, Council, Parliament...) and offers Treasury services for paying and receiving the cash on behalf of external entities.

WE PROPOSE

We are offering an opportunity to join Unit C1 – Treasury management, a dynamic and fast-paced environment at the center of the European Commission's financial operations.

The successful candidate will provide administrative, secretarial and organisational support to the Head of Unit and the Unit as a whole, working closely with approximately 35 colleagues across the unit.

The successful candidate will provide support across four core domains:

1. Administrative assistance:
 - Help the Head of Unit with daily organization and internal communication
 - Manage SYSPER actions, coordinate meeting logistics, track recruitment processes
 - Facilitate teamwork and horizontal coordination using M365 applications



2. Secretarial support:
 - Manage the Head of Unit's calendar, monitor functional mailboxes, handle Ares files
 - Organize mission in MIPS and draft notes according to EC standards and EUROLOOK
3. Operational support:
 - Streamline administrative processes and assist with staffing or organizational changes
 - Act as a link with the Document Management Officer and follow internal control standards
4. Document management:
 - Process incoming/outgoing correspondence and manage e-signature procedures
 - Ensure accurate archiving and proper filing of unit documentation

WE LOOK FOR

We look for a dynamic, proactive, and service-oriented colleague with the ability to combine secretarial support with administrative coordination responsibilities in a fast-paced working environment.

The successful candidate should have experience in administrative and secretarial support. The ability to prioritise, meet deadlines under pressure, and maintain attention to detail.

A good command of corporate IT tools (such as ARES, MIPS, SharePoint, TEAMS and Office 365) would be an asset.

The ideal profile combines a solid background in document management and agenda coordination with personal qualities such as good organizational skills, discretion, reliability, and the ability to thrive in a multicultural environment.

With a view to guaranteeing equal access to all, the Commission recruits from an open database of spontaneous applications. The present call for interests aims at helping the recruiters to identify potentially interested candidates within this database.

ANNEX

1. Selection

➤ Am I eligible to apply?

You must meet the following eligibility criteria when you validate your application:

Our rules provide that you can only be recruited as a contract agent at the European Commission if you:

General criteria:

- Are a citizen of a Member State of the EU and enjoy full rights as a citizen;
- Have fulfilled any obligations imposed by applicable laws concerning military service;
- Are physically fit to perform the duties linked to the position;
- Produce the appropriate character references as to suitability for the performance of the duties.
- Have passed an EPSO CAST in the relevant Function Group for this position. At the stage of the application, it is sufficient to be registered in the [EPSO CAST](#) data base.

Qualifications:

- (a) Have a level of post-secondary education attested by a diploma OR
- (b) a level of secondary education attested by a diploma giving access to post-secondary education, and appropriate professional experience of at least three years.

Only qualifications issued or recognised as equivalent by EU Member State authorities (e.g. by the Ministry of Education) will be accepted.

Languages:

- have a thorough knowledge (minimum level C1) of one of the 24 official languages of the EU¹
- AND have a satisfactory knowledge (minimum level B2)² of a second official language of the EU, to the extent necessary for the performance of the duties.

➤ What about the selection steps?

The selecting unit chooses from [the EPSO database](#)³ candidates with the appropriate profile and invites them to an interview. For the interview a selection panel is set-up to assess the best

candidates. Due to the large volume of applications that we may receive only candidates selected for the interview will be notified.

For operational reasons and in order to complete the selection procedure as quickly as possible in the interest of the candidates and of the institution, the selection procedure will be carried out in English and possibly in a second official language.

2. Recruitment

The candidate selected for recruitment will be requested to provide documentary evidence in support of the statements made in the database and, where relevant, the call for interest.

The successful candidate will be required to undergo a mandatory pre-recruitment medical check-up carried out by the Commission.

➤ Type of contract and working conditions

The place of employment will be in **Brussels**.

The successful candidate will be engaged as a **contract agent under Article 3(b) of the [Conditions of Employment of Other Servants](#), in function group FG II**. General information on Contract Agents can be found at this link.

The grade or proposed grade range, as well as the step in that grade, will be defined on the basis of the candidates' previous professional experience, in accordance with [Commission Decision C\(2017\)6760](#) laying down the criteria applicable to classification in step on engagement.

The duration of the **first contract will be 1 year**. Subject to the interest of the service, the contract may be renewed one or more times, up to a maximum duration of 6 years.

The duration of the renewal(s) will be defined according to the General Implementing Rules in force at that moment (currently, [Commission Decision C\(2017\)6760](#) on policies for the engagement and use of contract agents).

Contract agents recruited in Function Group II must successfully complete a 9-month probationary period.

The pay of staff members consists of a basic salary supplemented with specific allowances, including, where applicable, expatriation and family allowances. The provisions guiding the calculation of these allowances can be consulted in the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants. As a member of staff of the European institutions, your pay is subject to a tax raised by those institutions.

The European Commission applies a policy of equal opportunities and non-discrimination in accordance with Article 1d of the Staff Regulations.
